GET INVOLVED

Community groups (residents' associations, Scout and Girlguiding groups, youth and sports clubs, Rotary Clubs etc) are encouraged to get involved in Planting a Tree for the Platinum Jubilee in celebration of The Queen's 70 years of Service to the Nation.

The Woodland Trust is a partner of the QGC and their **Free Trees for Schools and Communities Scheme** is a great way to get involved with tree planting. Across 2021 and 2022 they have over three million saplings in tree packs, available on a first come first served basis. Information on how to apply for the free saplings is available through the **Woodland Trust website**.

From October, you can photograph your Jubilee tree and upload it on to the **QGC map**.

You may also wish to order an **official plaque** to mark the occasion for generations to come. Templates for QGC plaques with suggested wording and recommended suppliers will be available on this site from September 2021 ready for when the tree planting season begins in October.
